Getting Started: Steps to Open Your Business



Step 1: Business Planning

- Refine Your Business Idea:
 Make sure your business
 concept fits within the unique
 culture of downtown
 Bennettsville. Consider your
 target audience, what products
 or services you offer, and how
 you'll stand out.
- Business Plan: Develop a thorough business plan that outlines your vision, target market, competition, financial projections, and marketing strategies.





Step 2: Contact Main Street Bennettsville

 Reach out to our team to schedule a consultation. We can provide insights into the local market, available properties, and connect you with resources that can assist in launching your business.



Step 3: Choose a Location

- Available Properties: Main
 Street Bennettsville maintains a
 list of available properties
 downtown. Let us help you find
 a space that fits your business
 needs.
- Zoning and Permits: Ensure
 that your business complies with
 local zoning regulations. The
 City of Bennettsville's Planning
 and Zoning department can
 assist with building permits,
 signage, and occupancy
 approvals.



Step 4: Legal Requirements

- Register Your Business:
 Register your business with the South Carolina Secretary of State and obtain a business license through the City of Bennettsville.
- Federal Employer
 Identification Number (EIN): If required, apply for an EIN from the IRS.



Step 5: Financial Assistance

- Grants & Incentives: Main
 Street Bennettsville provides
 resources for small business
 grants to connect business
 owners with local, state, and
 federal funding
 opportunities. Ask about our
 Façade Improvement Grants
 to assist with exterior
 improvements to downtown
 properties.
- Local Financial Institutions:
 We can connect you with
 local banks and credit unions
 that specialize in small
 business loans.



Step 6: Design & Renovation

 Historic Preservation: If your business is located in one of our historic buildings, consider how to maintain its charm while making necessary updates. We can provide design guidelines and recommendations for historic renovations.
